Videography Requirements Checklist

	Flagging tape or blue painter's tape should be used to mark the
	edge of the ring, in 10 foot intervals, along all four sides of the ring.
	Video of ring set up, with videographer standing in the center of the
	ring and slowly panning along each side is required for every test
	run submission. All obstacles and 10 foot markers must be visible in
	this set up video.
	In outdoor venues, it is best to videotape with the sun to the
	videographer's back.
	While there is a suggested videographer location on the course
	map, the videographer does not have to stand inside the ring or in
	the suggested position.
	During the test run videographer must pan (follow) the handler and
	dog, keeping both within the frame of the video camera. It is most
	important to keep the dog in view of the camera.
	The DATE & TIME STAMP DISPLAY should be turned on if possible
	(but it is not required)
	Video must be taken in a format suitable for upload to YouTube
	Test video should be named in the following format:
	Date_Level_DogName (Date should be in the two digit month, day, year format)
	Video of ring set up should be taken <u>after</u> the test run, immediately
	following the completion of the test run
	The ring-set up may be a separate video from the test run.
	The original soundtrack of the video recording must be submitted,
	and not dubbed or replaced with music.
	Absolutely no editing should be done of the test run itself. Failure
	to comply with this rule will disqualify the handler from
	participating in any future rounds of Virtual Agility League tests.
